Both plays were performed in repertory at UCSB in February/March 2016. The Death of Kings won seven Santa Barbara Independent awards for direction, adaptation, performance and design. A third play, The Death of Kings: Seize the Crown, a ninety minute compilation of the two main plays, received its European premiere at the Prague Shakespeare Company's Summer Shakespeare Intensive in 2017, and a more recent production traveled to Southwest Shakespeare Company in March 2019. https://thedeathofkingsofficial.wordpress.com. In August 2023, Naked Shakes performed The Death of Kings to be the closing act of the Verona Shakespeare Fringe Festival in Verona, Italy, part of the European Shakespeare Festivals Network. In fall 2023, I will direct The Death of Kings as Visiting Professor at Jagiellonian University, Kraków, Poland.
- <u>Director, Trapped in Amber</u>, a new play by Carlos Morton, commissioned by the International Border Studies Center and University of Gdańsk, Poland, and in collaboration with the Musical Theatre School of Danuta Baduskowa in Gdynia, Poland.
